

LSE Summer School Application Criteria 2025

In order to apply for the LSE Summer School, students must satisfy our entry requirements as follows:

- **100 level courses**: proof of an offer of a place at university for the upcoming academic year or a transcript showing current or previous attendance of a university.
- 200 and 300 level courses: a university transcript showing you meet course specific
 prerequisites. These prerequisites are different for each course and can be found on the
 LSE Summer School website.
- You are also required to provide evidence of meeting our language requirements (if a non-native English speaker).

We expect all applicants to show grades of around B+ (GPA 3.3). We do not expect all students to have grade for B+ or higher in each module, however, there needs to be an average of around a B+. In some instances, it may be possible to accept slightly lower grades, depending on the strength of the application. Those who do not meet the expected grade or exact prerequisites are taken on a case-by-case basis and will have their application assessed by the programme directors for each course.

For the admissions team and programme directors to assess each application effectively, transcripts must be translated into English if they are not already. Transcripts must clearly state the student's name and the full name of their university.

For those who need to provide evidence of meeting specific prerequisites, students should indicate which module codes and titles on their academic transcript correspond with each prerequisite. It is recommended that a course outline is also provided so that programme directors can see what content is being covered which would enable students to successfully complete the course. If studying more than one Summer School course, a relevant course from a previous session could act as a prerequisite.
